## Minutes from the mid-course meeting Financial Time Series TMS088/MSA410

- What is the student representatives and the examiners impression of the course so far?
  - Annika's impression: little contact with the students via discussion session and email, no complaints so far. Student representatives: good and clear setup, good course, quick replies to questions, good with recordings combined with live sessions, people not coming to the discussions might be caused by not having caught up in the video lectures and therefore not being prepared on time, very good exercise sessions.
- Do the student representatives feel that the course provides students with the right opportunities for absorbing the learning outcomes?
  - Opportunities are given but not necessarily used. Not everybody is aware of the opportunity to ask questions on projects on the discussion board, in any exercise session and by email at any time. Replies are guaranteed at teaching hours and given if time admits.
- Is the alignment between learning outcomes, learning activities and examining parts (the constructive alignment) clear to the students?
  - It is clear. To clarify the grading of the final exam: The maximum number of points that can be achieved in the exam is 60 points. You need 30 points to pass the exam (for GU: 30 points for G and 45 points for VG, for Chalmers 30 points for 3, 40 points for 4, and 50 points for 5). - Is all information about the different parts of the course and about deadlines clear to the students? Are deadlines reasonable in relation to each other and to deadlines in parallel courses?
  - Clear and reasonable. Deadlines are okay with dates for bachelor's theses at Chalmers.

    lecture was given with prerecorded lectures, recorded exercise solving, discussion and

    year? Describe the advantages and disadvantages that you see compared to classical

lectures or live streaming. How did you organize your work given the increased flexibility? Which challenges did you face?
